

Saturday 19th May 2007 - Ring of Kerry

10:00am start from the Heights Hotel car park

The Ring of Kerry scenic route around the Iveragh Peninsula is the most popular drive in Ireland and certainly one of the most beautiful.

Killarney is the ideal starting point for the ring of Kerry and one of the reasons we have chosen the town as our base for the extended 3MA weekend.

Being the most popular drive in Ireland, it is well signposted so we didn't feel there is a need for detailed route instructions. Instead we'll "follow the leader" and take the N72 to Kilorglin from where we'll follow the signposts for 'Ring' - this will lead us round the coast road in an anti-clockwise direction. Not only does this route provide the best views of the scenery, but since the big tour buses always go this way, we'll also avoid meeting one of them head-on round an awkward corner!

The Ring of Kerry is just over 100 miles (170Km) so we've allowed a full day to drive it which will include multiple stops. Starting time from the Heights Hotel car park on Saturday is expected to be 10:00am but this might change following discussions amongst participants on Friday night. If you miss this discussion please telephone one of the organisers for confirmation of the start time.



Sunday 20th May 2007 - Lakes of Killarney and static 3MA display



The **Lakes of Killarney** are a renowned scenic attraction and they consist of three lakes - Lough Leane, Muckross Lake (also called Middle Lake) and Upper Lake. Lough Leane meaning *Lake of Learning* is the largest of the three lakes.

Ladies View is a scenic stopping point on the N71 road from Killarney to Kenmare that offers a view of the lakes and valleys.

Sunday 20th May is planned to be the static 3MA display in the Heights Hotel car park. That'll be your chance to have a detailed look at all the cars



Monday 21st May 2007 - Ring of Beara



The Beara Peninsula in Ireland is the southernmost of the main peninsulas on the south-west coast. The northern part of the peninsula, except near the tip of it, is in County Kerry, while the rest lies in County Cork.

The Beara Peninsula is Ireland in a nutshell, with a landscape that is beautiful, magical and full of rugged charm. The Ring of Beara links the towns of Glengarrif in Cork with Kenmare in Kerry, in a round about fashion. Between Glengarrif and Castletownbere the road is flanked by exposed banks of jagged rock with the rugged peaks of Sugarloaf Mountain and Hungry Hill in the Caha Mountains. And of course the Ring of Beara includes the famous 13Km Healy Pass, a twisty mountain road from Adrigole Bridge in County Cork to Lauragh Bridge in County Kerry.

At 122miles / 195Km, the Ring of Beara is a good day's driving. Once again we expect to have several stops during the drive.


